

- Ensure adequate number of teachers in schools (high priority be given to 1 and 2 teacher schools)
- Ensure all schools have functional toilets, clean drinking water and boundary walls, specially for girls

56% men and 38% women aged 10 years and older are literate in Bahawalpur. Overall, the district is ranked 30 among 37 districts on literacy indicator. 1

Enrollment

- Children in the 3-5 age group: 47% are enrolled (43% girls and 57% boys). Of this percentage, 50% children are enrolled in government schools and 50% in private educational facilities.²
- Children in the 6-16 age group: 80% are enrolled (40% girls and 60% boys). Of this percentage, 61% children are enrolled in government schools and 39% in private educational facilities.²
- Out-of-school children: 20% children (6-16 years) are not attending any school. Out of this number, 50% are girls and 50% boys. 2



Children

- 44% of class 3 students in government schools and 61% in private schools are able to read sentences in Urdu
- 36% of class 3 students in government schools and 64% in private schools are able to do simple subtraction
- 57% of class 3 students in government schools and 70% in private schools are able to read words in English
