## Chiniot





58 % men and 29% women aged 10 years and older are literate in Chiniot. Overall, the district is ranked 34 among 36 districts on literacy indicator. 1

#### **Enrollment**

- Children in the 3-5 age group: 50% are enrolled (41% girls and 59% boys). Of this percentage, 76% children are enrolled in government schools and 24% in private educational facilities.<sup>2</sup>
- Children in the 6-16 age group: 75% are enrolled (43% girls and 57% boys). Of this percentage, 82% children are enrolled in government schools and 16% in private educational facilities.<sup>2</sup>
- Out-of-school children: 25% children (6-16 years) are not attending any school. Out of this number, 64% are girls and 36% boys. 2





### **Urgent Action and Suggestions**

- Up gradation of more primary schools to elementary and high schools.
- More development budget to be allocated for education department as current budgetary allocation for the district education department is insufficient.
- Current ongoing recruitment process should be speeded up and vacant posts should be filled as soon as possible.
- For ensuring quality of education and better learning levels of the children, better and effective M&E is needed.
  Teachers have also demanded not to be involved in the other than Education and teaching activities i.e. Census,
  Voter lists, Polio duties.
- Community mobilization and effective strategies from education department and district government is required in order to achieve gender parity in education.
- For out of schools adolescents Literacy and NFPBE department need to open more centers and those too in such areas where they are actually needed.
- Political involvement in Literacy department for sanction centers on political basis should be discouraged
