Enrollment

- **Children in the 3-5 age group:** 54% are enrolled (38% girls and 62% boys). Of this percentage, 77% children are enrolled in government schools and 33% in private educational facilities.⁴
- **Children in the 6-16 age group:** 98% are enrolled (28% girls and 72% boys). Of this percentage, 76% children are enrolled in government schools and 24% in private educational facilities.⁴
- **Out-of-school children:** 2% children (6-16 years) are not attending any school. Out of this number, 50% are girls and 50% boys.⁴

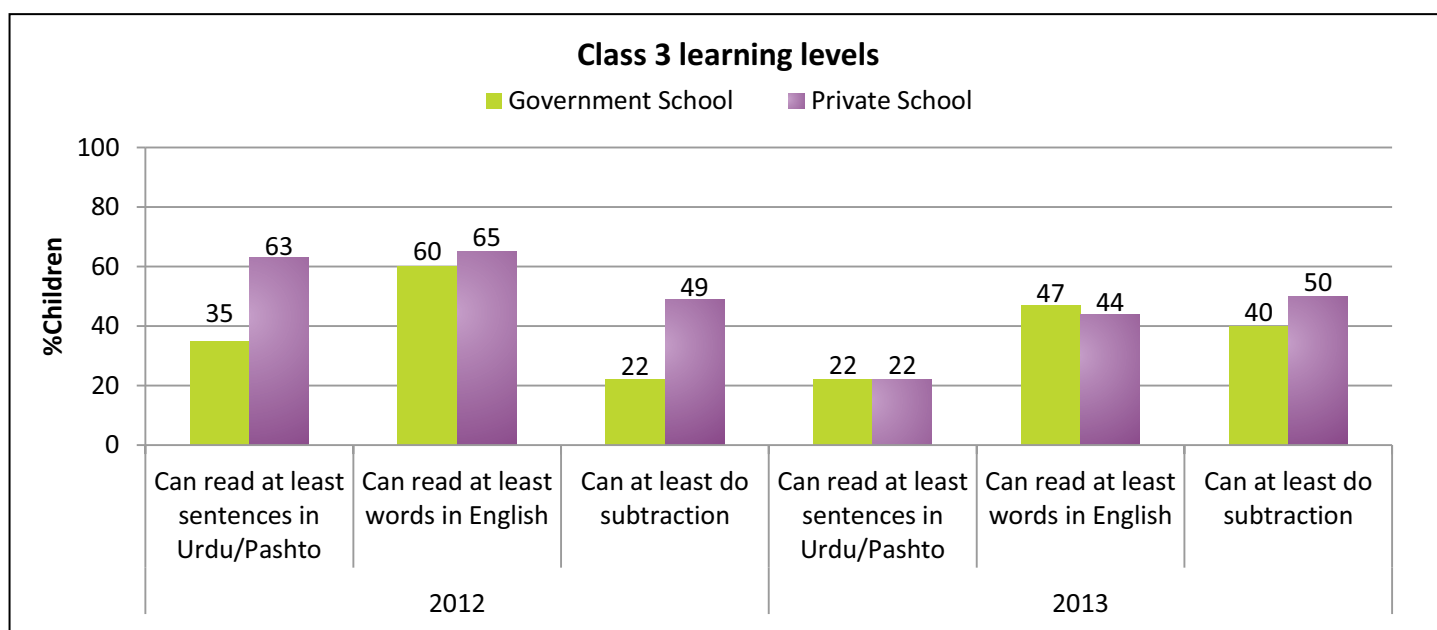

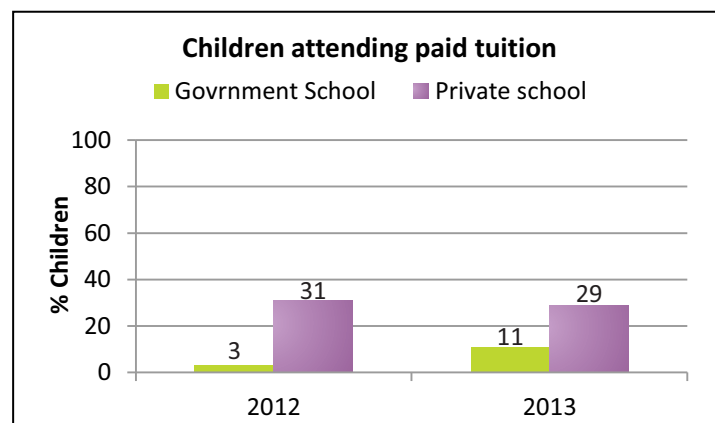
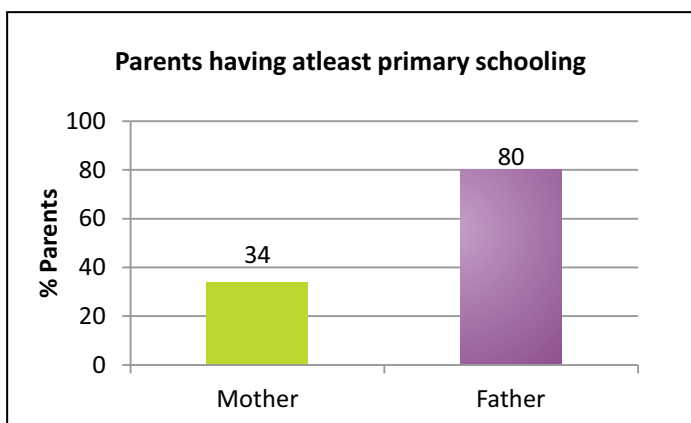


Learning Levels (Rural)⁴

- 22% of class 3 students in government and 22% in private schools are able to read sentences in **Urdu/Pashto** as compared to 35% in government and 63% in private schools in 2012.
- 47% of class 3 students in government and 44% in private schools are able to read words in **English** as compared to 60% in government and 65% in private schools in 2012.
- 40% of class 3 students in government and 50% in private schools are able to do simple **Subtraction** as compared to 22% in government and 49% in private schools in 2012.
