Enrollment

- **Children in the 3-5 age group:** 34% are enrolled (40% girls and 60% boys). Of this percentage, 58% children are enrolled in government schools and 42% in private educational facilities.⁴
- **Children in the 6-16 age group:** 90% are enrolled (33% girls and 67% boys). Of this percentage, 67% children are enrolled in government schools and 33% in private educational facilities.⁴
- **Out-of-school children:** 10% children (6-16 years) are not attending any school. Out of this number, 75% are girls and 25% boys.⁴

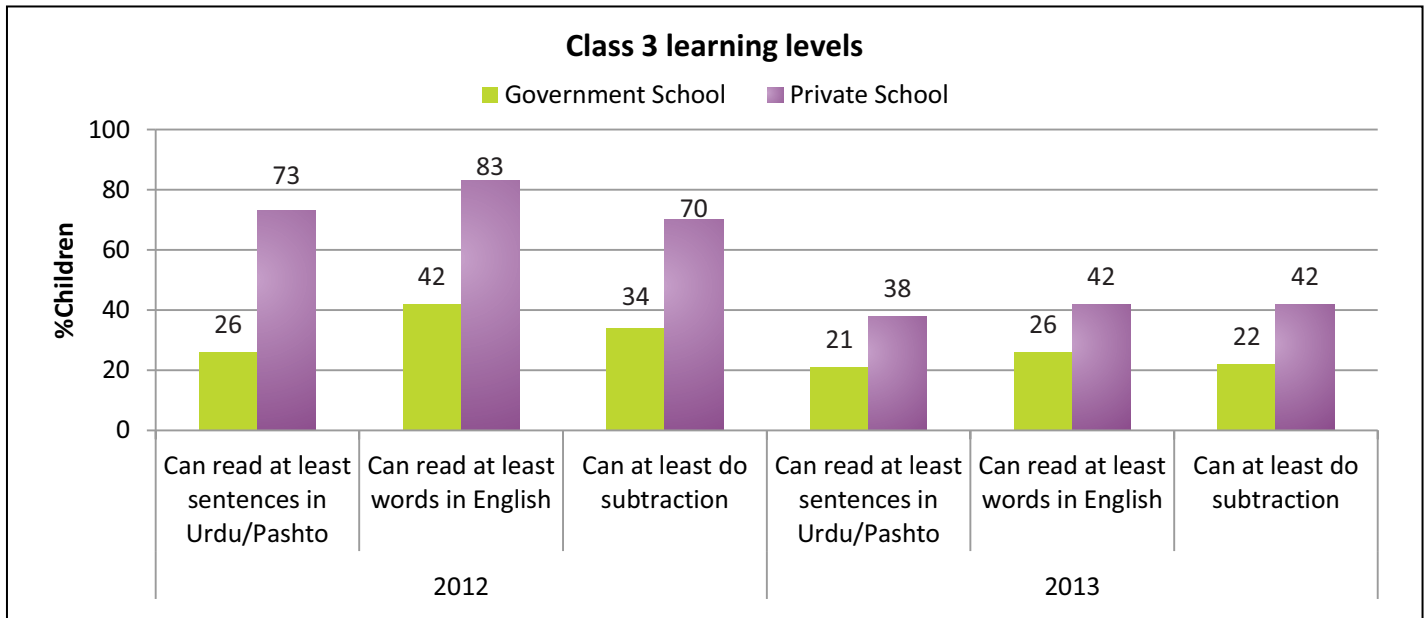

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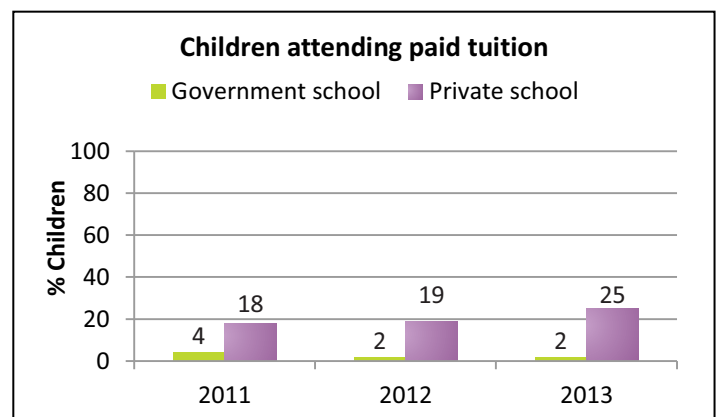
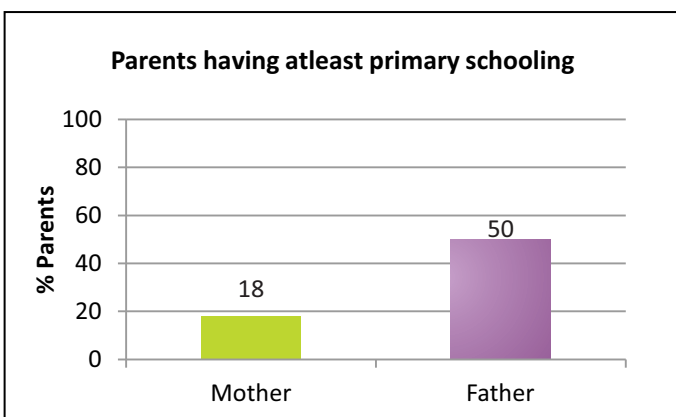


Learning Levels (Rural)⁴

- 21% of class 3 students in government and 38% in private schools are able to read sentences in **Urdu/Pashto** as compared to 26% in government and 73% in private schools in 2012.
- 26% of class 3 students in government and 42% in private schools are able to read words in **English** as compared to 42% in government and 83% in private schools in 2012.
- 22% of class 3 students in government and 42% in private schools are able to do simple **Subtraction** as compared to 34% in government and 70% in private schools in 2012.
