**Enrollment**

- **Children in the 3-5 age group:** 45% are enrolled (39% girls and 61% boys). Of this percentage, 75% children are enrolled in government schools and 25% in private educational facilities.<sup>4</sup>
- **Children in the 6-16 age group:** 73% are enrolled (37% girls and 63% boys). Of this percentage, 72% children are enrolled in government schools and 28% in private educational facilities.<sup>4</sup>
- **Out-of-school children:** 27% children (6-16 years) are not attending any school. Out of this number, 53% are girls and 47% boys.<sup>4</sup>

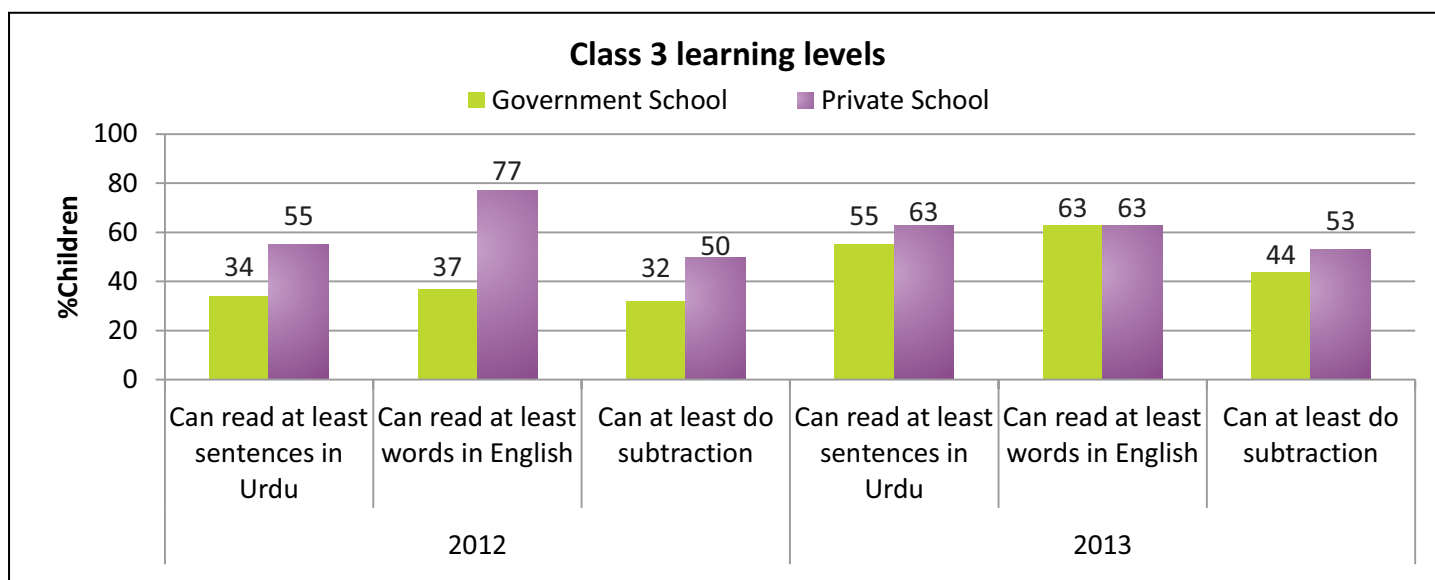

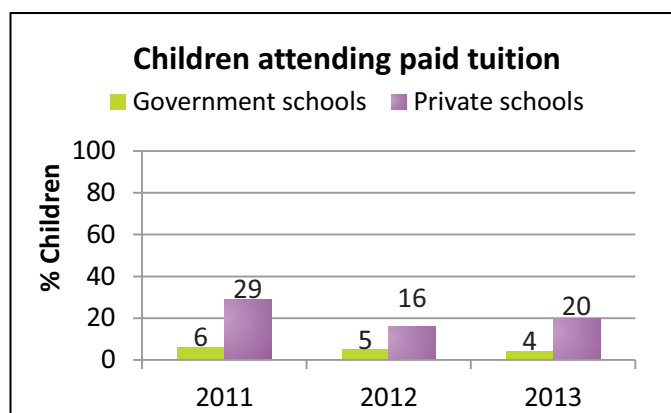
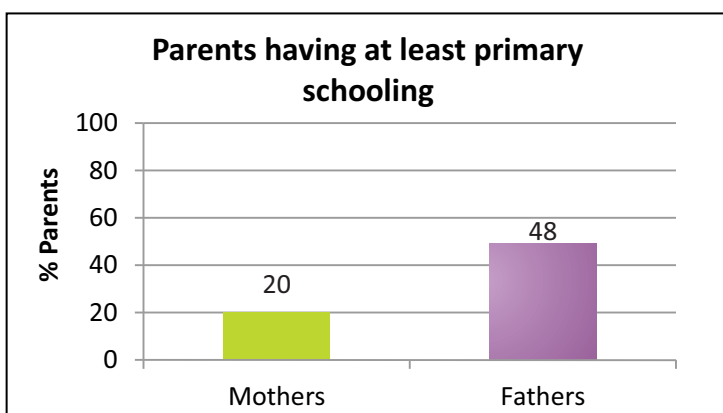


**Learning Levels (Rural)<sup>4</sup>**

- 55% of class 3 students in government schools and 63% in private schools are able to read sentences in **Urdu** as compared to 34% in government and 55% in private schools in 2012.
- 63% of class 3 students in government schools and 63% in private schools are able to read words in **English** as compared to 37% in government and 77% in private schools in 2012.
- 44% of class 3 students in government schools and 53% in private schools are able to do simple **Subtraction** as compared to 32% in government and 50% in private schools in 2012.
