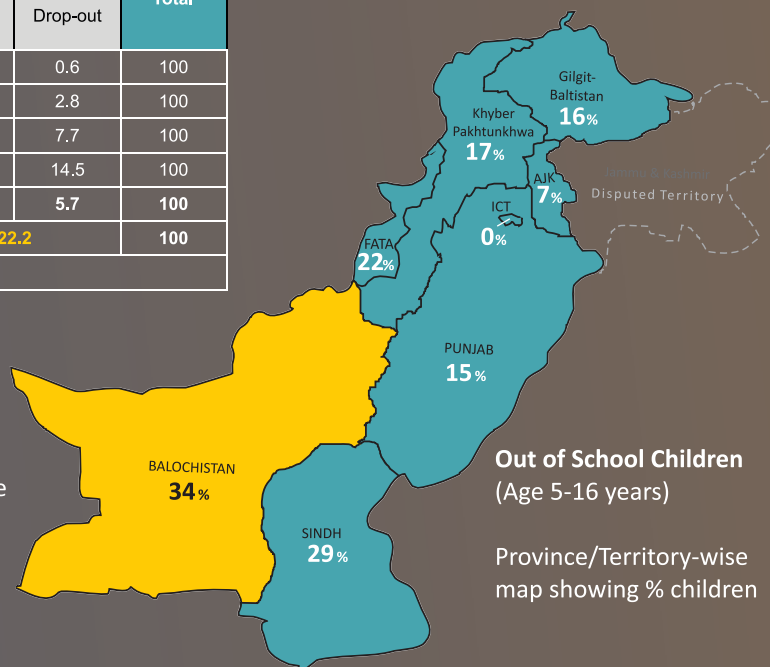

- 78% children are enrolled in schools.
- Only 32% children are getting education in non-state schools.

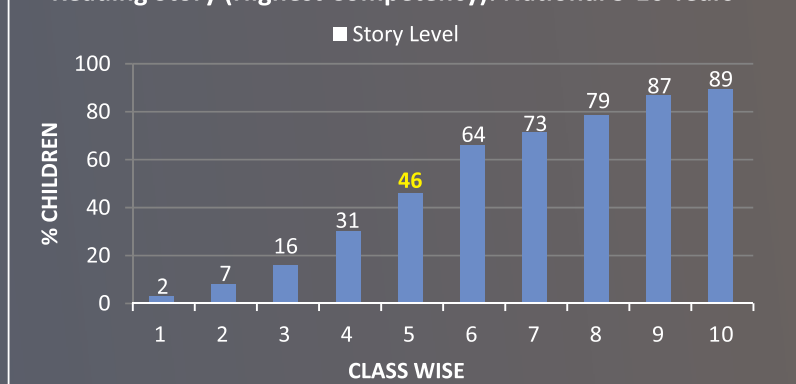
HIGHEST PERCENTAGE OF OUT-OF-SCHOOL CHILDREN (Province/Territory-wise)

Balochistan has the highest number of out of school children i.e. 34% of age 5-16 years



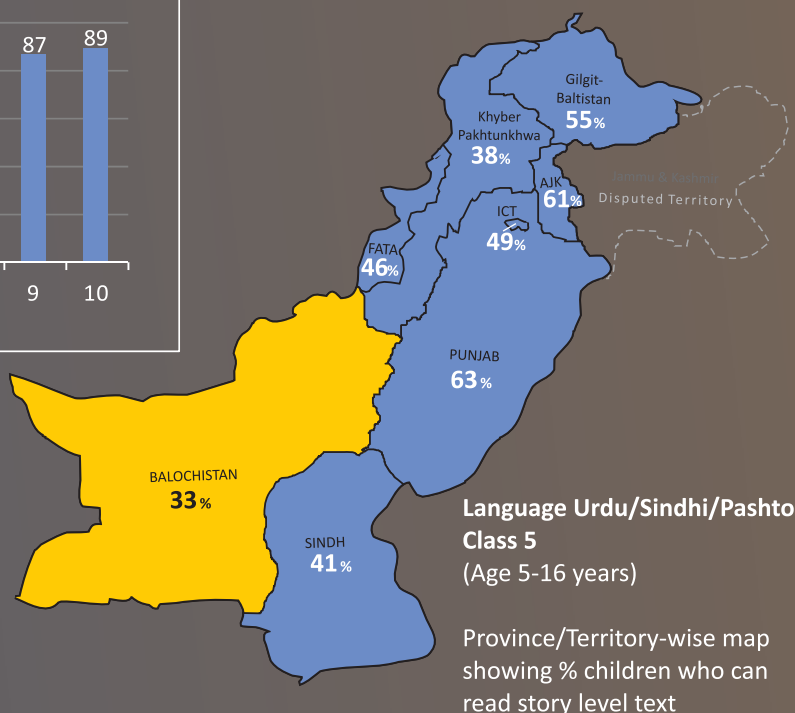
LEARNING LEVELS (Urdu/Sindhi/Pashto)

Reading Story (Highest Competency): National 5-16 Years



ASER National results show that 46% children enrolled in Class 5 are able to read a story in Urdu/Sindhi/Pashto.

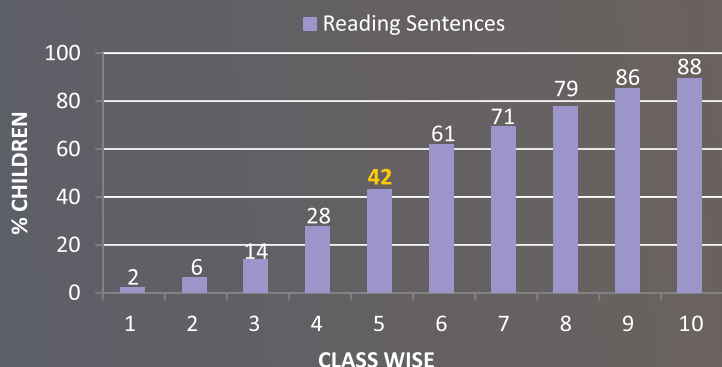
Balochistan has the lowest percentage of children (5-16 years) performing the basic reading task. Only 33% of children enrolled in class 5 are able to read a story of class 2 level.



Language Urdu/Sindhi/Pashto Class 5 (Age 5-16 years)

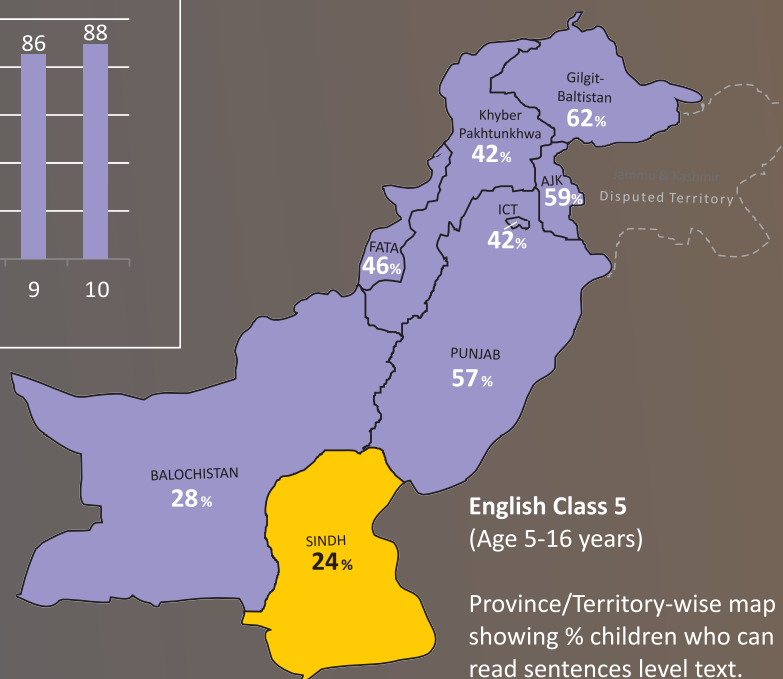
LEARNING LEVELS (English)

Reading Sentences (Highest Competency): National 5-16 Years



ASER National results show that **42%** children enrolled in Class 5 are able to read sentences in English.

Sindh has the lowest percentage of children (5-16 years) performing the basic English task. Only **24%** of children are able to read English sentences of class 2 level.

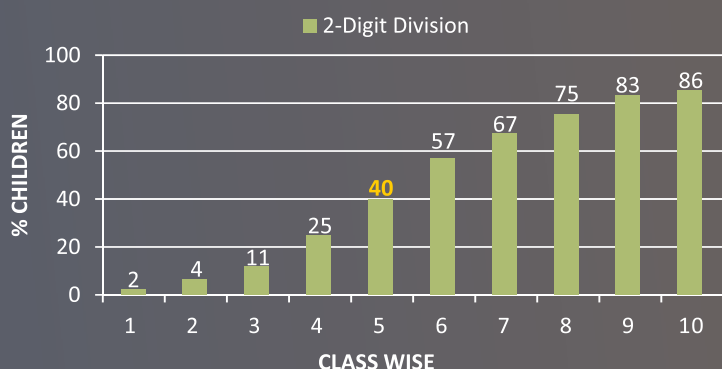


English Class 5

Province/Territory-wise map showing % children who can read sentences level text.

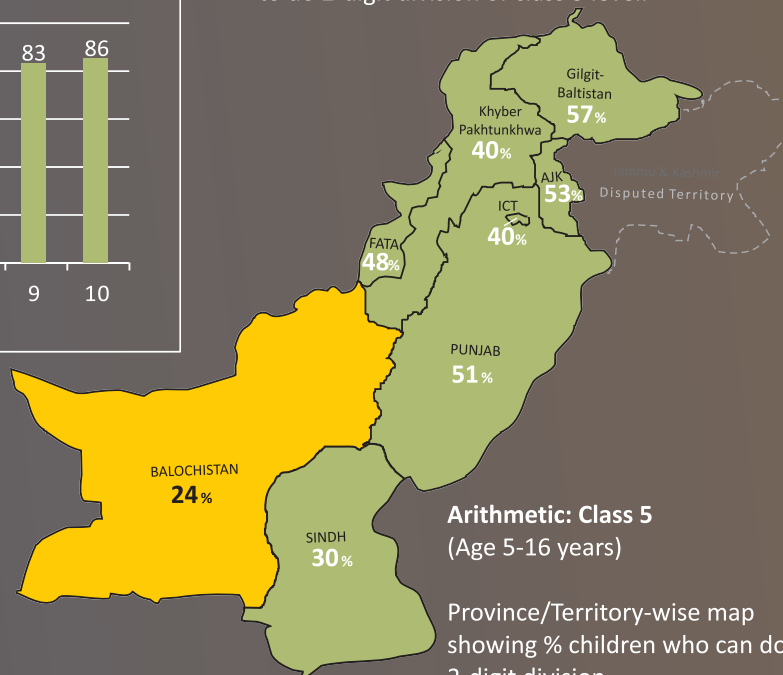
LEARNING LEVELS (Arithmetic)

2-Digit Division (Highest Competency): National 5-16 Years



ASER National results show that **40%** children enrolled in Class 5 are able to solve 2-digit division.

Balochistan has the lowest percentage of children (5-16 years) performing the basic Arithmetic task. Only **24%** of children are able to do 2-digit division of class 3 level.

(Age 5-16 years)

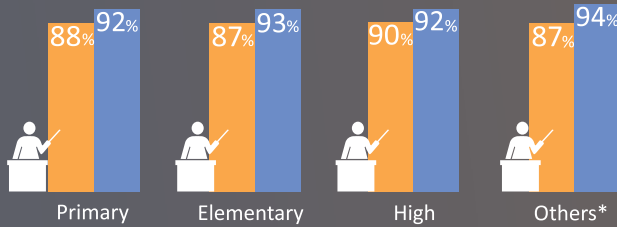
Province/Territory-wise map showing % children who can do 2-digit division.

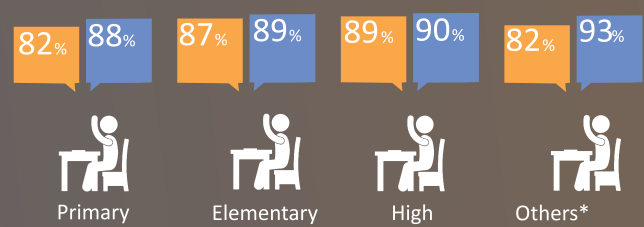

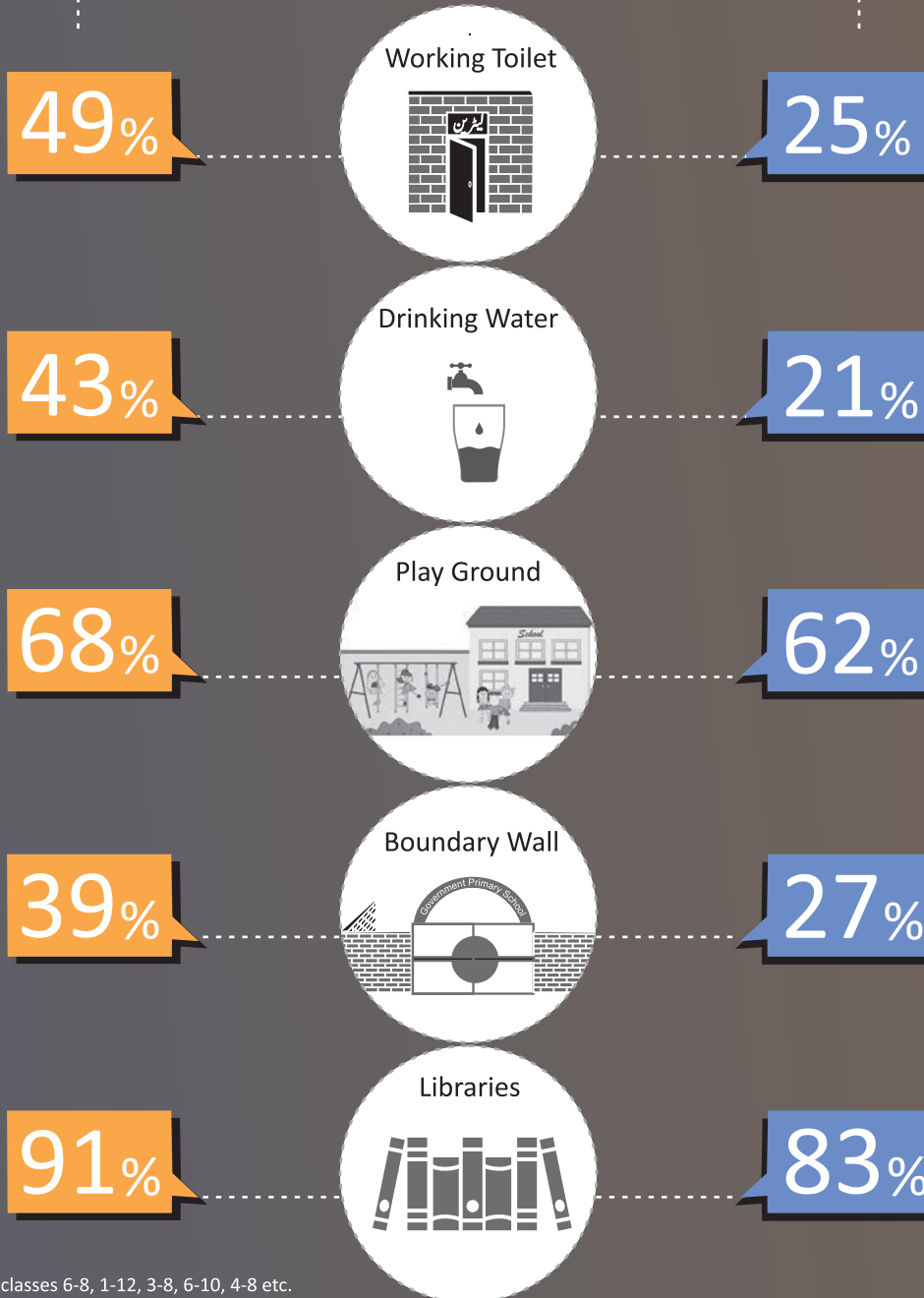
