



#### HIGHEST PERCENTAGE OF OUT-OF-SCHOOL CHILDREN (Province/Territory-wise)


Balochistan has the highest number of out of school children i.e. 34% of age 5-16 years



#### **3 FACTS ABOUT ENROLLMENT:**


- 22% children (aged 5-16 years) are out of school in Pakistan.
- 78% children are enrolled in schools.
- Only 32% children are getting education in non-state schools.

# LEARNING LEVELS (Urdu/Sindhi/Pashto)



ASER National results show that 46% children enrolled in Class 5 are able to read a story in Urdu/Sindhi/Pashto.

Balochistan has the lowest percentage of children (5-16 years) performing the basic reading task. Only 33% of children enrolled in class 5 are able to read a story of class 2 level.




read story level text


