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Executive Summary

This report centers around a collaborative effort by Idara-e-Taleem o Aagahi (ITA) and Aliif Ailaan titled “*Politicians Knocking on Doors*”. Under the umbrella of *PKD* the newly established government was approached, alongside various other political heads and ministers, with a roadmap constituting of seven steps, which if adopted correctly could help bring an end to the Education Emergency. Knocking on doors came about as a means to help politicians become champions of society and to mobilize citizens who would provide the votes and participation in ASER trials, enabling access for leaders to a potentially powerful vote bank. Manifestos were drafted and it became imperative that Education be made one of the critical factors that would determine the vote.

After the successful completion and documentation of 22 events PKD has achieved a milestone in terms of scale and outreach, touching 4 major provinces of Pakistan and involving leading Politicians in the process. Initially PKD was scheduled only in Punjab and KPK with only 20 events planned however after the initial success it was scaled up with 4 events in Balochistan and 2 in Sindh, 9 in Punjab, 1 ICT and 6 KPK.

Each Politician carried out active enrollment which not only provides a few children a golden opportunity but also garners a culture of such practices involving both boys and girls were all across Pakistan. Aside from this, it is an achievement to have a multitude of leaders from varying political backgrounds coming together on 7 key messages that have been delivered along the entire length and breadth of Pakistan.

Introduction

Pakistan's first democratic shift between governments was an opportune moment to highlight the gaps and needs of Education in Pakistan. The process would involve strong engagement by political parties driven by a vote bank of Pakistani citizens who attained a valuable platform to call for change.

Politicians Knocking on the Door (PKD) and *Alif Ailaan* jointly approached the newly established government, alongside various other political heads and ministers, with a roadmap constituting of seven steps, which if adopted correctly could help bring an end to the Education Emergency.

Knocking on doors came about as a means to help politicians become champions of society and to mobilize citizens who would provide the votes and participation in ASER trials, enabling access for leaders to a potentially powerful vote bank. Manifestos were drafted and it became imperative that Education be made one of the critical factors that would determine the vote.

The activities included the politician/s identifying two to five out of school children of school going age. Once identified, these out of school children were physically taken to the area government school for immediate enrolment. Thus the knocking on doors of ordinary citizens to mobilize votes for education in Pakistan, and enrolling children in schools in a local area became winning concrete practices for politicians.

The idea behind this activity was to rebrand of the image of politicians, mobilizing older and younger generations at one stroke, as campaigns that will make a difference to the social and economic fabric of the country. This two stage activity (knocking on homes and enrolling out of school children in schools) were a source of rich images and footage for the communication /mobilization campaigns of the politicians who were provided with these powerful 'footprints' for their political run up to the elections. It is one of the easiest ways to leverage the ASER trail in their own constituency, conjoining policy makers with direct stakeholders for irreversibly changing the status of education in Pakistan. The project was a great success with the conversations and actions for education becoming louder and more outcomes based in Pakistan.

P w P – Politicians with People

Knowledge in the 21st century is recognized as the key driver of socio-economic development, and for this reason Education must be made the number one national priority.

This change needs to be observed on multiple levels in depth under various dimensions, such as¹:

- Policy statements
- Financial allocations,
- Institutional reforms,
- Effective implementation of policies,
- An effective external monitoring and evaluation system.

In order to respond to the challenges of knowledge revolution and globalization, those in the establishment need to establish and devise such a system that not only promotes creativity, and also uphold practices that focus on improving analytical thinking, teamwork and help build and develop strong ethical foundations.

Education should be regarded as the greatest single equalizer in a society. Through this campaign the policy influencers can insist on an educated, technologically advanced and progressive society for the success of Pakistan. Educated, highly trained and skilled labor force, and properly qualified youth can become a driving force for achieving and maintaining growth, development and progress.

CRITERION FOR ACHIEVING SEVEN STEPS FOR PKD

It is no secret that education plays a foundational role in the progressive growth of a society. Education can help re-institutionalize and evolve various previously ineffectual bodies into platforms that can develop greater prospects of achieving positive social change, political progress and general welfare in a nation.

This campaign was able to devise and formulate seven achievable solutions for politicians to assist in overcoming the education emergency. It is pertinent to elaborate a coherent and cognitive step wise process to develop a methodology for change which extends from the up to bottom involving all spheres of the society.

Politicians Knocking on Doors and *Alif Ailaan* joined hands to organize this campaign with the aim of involving politicians from all regional and federal districts in order to address and counter the on-going educational emergency swelling within Pakistan.

Through this conjoined effort we hope to revive ‘hope’ amongst the people of Pakistan, and with this agenda set in mind PKD directed an appeal to these political heroes, pressing for their support, seeking assistance in instigating a dynamic change, commencing from within their own respective constituencies’ in order to profoundly evoke and spread this tsunami of literacy.

These Steps are based upon measures that can be taken to ensure the general welfare of the overall society by carefully deploying, and in return actualizing the returns yielded from these cleverly devised development and growth strategies that support illiteracy eradication.

Seven Steps: ERADICATE ILLITERACY

STEP ONE: There is a dire need for the entire nation to declare a National Educational Crisis Emergency in the country, not only as a top priority and emergency in front of local community inclusive of all ages, but also inclusive of both genders (with segregated space allotted individually) to address the most critical issues to mobilize an action plan for awareness and consciousness amongst the people. Pakistan desperately requires a new framework for social change that can accommodate and provide equal opportunities and social justice to everyone, while eliminating exploitation of the poor, harnessing its human resource potential, and restoring dignity and respect amongst the citizens. Assimilated programs of such a case create kind social development and broaden partnerships between different segments of society, while aid in reducing injustice and intolerance society, and help achieve the *Millennium Development Goals 2015*.

STEP TWO: Knock on doors to enquire about education (learning and access), challenges being faced by households at the local level, and ask for their demands. Use the *ASER Trials* to test and devise not only the causes and challenges faced by the people but also identifying the varying barriers to education alongside the various inevitable repercussions and outcomes. A national literacy movement can be launched in which volunteers from all the segments of society can be requested and motivated to participate and help in conducting these ASER Trials.

STEP THREE: Take out-of-school children 3-6 to get them enrolled into the local schools free of cost, marking the politician's initiative - walking the talk with promise to return to see if children are still learning and remain enrolled. Make the politicians sign on School Registers about their presence and promise to return again to visit the school.

STEP FOUR: Follow through on the rate of admission from each district and make efforts to get as many children back into school as possible in all constituencies. Ensure to provide sufficient resources to maintain institutes that help develop creative abilities of every child for the betterment of society. Facilities for teacher training should be expanded at a rapid pace in collaboration with the Provincial Governments to improve the quality of education and ensure a quality teacher in every classroom.

STEP FIVE: By the end of the fiscal year, each party should identify and state 3 to 5 key actions to highlight the education input agenda within their own framework and the broader national structure. For instance policies on how to tackle various hurdles such as, Dropout rate at primary level will be reduced by providing missing facilities in schools and free text books, offering incentives, especially for girls, or pass an order appealing to request the government to set up Danish Schools in all provinces.

STEP SIX: Ensure strict implementation of these renewed educational actions and policies, and take steps to carry out appropriate allocation of budget towards education, and maintain 4-5% of GDP at least for education in the future governance institutions. Transparently highlight investment on the tangible spectrum for education and make a considerable investment towards quality of education. Direct a provision of budget to alternate means of finance such as, untapped natural resources.

STEP SEVEN: *ITA /ASER* to track the actions over the coming year/s using ASER BAIHAKS to generate and identify gaps in quality of learning and the outcomes of a progressive education. This campaign hopes to achieve a very result oriented outcome, identifying the underlying gaps and creating a problem solving approach towards each issue which is observed on a prominent and perpetual basis.

Outcomes and way forward

“Politicians Knocking on Doors” set out to bridge the gap between policy makers and the populace as well as to create a higher level of political consciousness and will to bring change. After the successful completion and documentation of 22 events PKD has achieved a milestone in terms of scale and outreach, touching 4 major provinces of Pakistan and involving leading Politicians in the process. Initially PKD was scheduled only in Punjab and KPK with only 20 events planned however after the initial success it was scaled up with 4 events in Balochistan and 2 in Sindh, 9 in Punjab, 1 ICT and 6 KPK.

Each Politician carried out active enrollment which not only provides a few children a golden opportunity but also garners a culture of such practices involving both boys and girls were all across Pakistan. Aside from this, it is an achievement to have a multitude of leaders from varying political backgrounds coming together on 7 key messages that have been delivered along the entire length and breadth of Pakistan.

14 events were completed before the elections however the fervor did not stop with the result. 8 more events were carried out post-election which shows the commitment garnered through such a project extending beyond simply gaining votes. PKD has created a higher social consciousness and is inspiring many other politicians to carry out similar projects in their constituencies.

With the help of [Alif Ailaan](#) and media partners, the footage from PKD has been compiled into a documentary which shows the story of each event in its own context. This effectively acted not only as a campaign boost which resulted in a good number of our participating candidates winning their seats, but also as a form of advocacy material that can be shown to communities where similar projects are to be initiated. The excellently produced video clips are mini documentaries in and of themselves highlighting the specific education emergencies of their respective areas and can be further disseminated to maintain lasting political will to act and change. This was best seen in the case of the education budgets which had never before received so much importance. The Education budget of KPK comprised almost 20% of the total amount which is truly a milestone achievement for this campaign.

The most important outcome is the sensitization of the communities where the events took place. Citizens not only were informed about education but were armed with a means to take action themselves through dealing with politicians and taking ownership of their right to education. Education became a major turning point for voting and people were given a platform to demand their right to free and compulsory education for all.

PKD's journey will not end with the closing of the project and will be followed by a seminar in which the political actors engaged will gather and sign a pledge to keep education as a top priority in all future work. This would also act as a benchmark for any future education policies from national to district levels.
